City Considers Retiring McKernan/Belgravia ARP

n a document released in August titled "District Planning: an Overview of Changes 2023", the city proposed the retirement of the McKernan/Belgravia Station Area Redevelopment Plan (ARP). This is a change from the 2022 proposal to keep the plan as a statutory document.

The city notes that the majority of policies in the ARP are reflected in the new Scona District Policy. However the ARP conflicts with the new City Plan in a few important ways, notably the recommended building heigh along the 114 Street corridor (14.5 m versus 23 m).

The conflicts between the ARP and The City Plan have been an important point of discussion in public hearings on major developments in McKernan such as the Metro78 project.

The McKernan/Belgravia Station ARP was approved by City Council in July 2013. It encompasses all of Belgravia and McKernan, except properties along 109 St. The document sets out the vision for land use and zoning decisions for the next 25 years. The stated goal of the document is to enhance and strengthen the local character of the neighbourhoods while promoting transit-oriented development and encouraging infill.

The will be a virtual information session specifically about the McKernan/Belgravia ARP on November 1, 2023. This will be a 1.5 hour session to explain why the ARP is being proposed for retirement. The presentation will be followed by a question and answer period. You can sign up for the virtual session by emailing districtplanning@edmonton.ca.

Counter Culture - Where to Eat in Scona District

Great Pizza in and around McKernan

reat food critics visit a restaurant multiple times before publishing a review, allowing them to taste the full menu and evaluate the consistency of the food and service. By this criterion, I can think of no other set of restaurants I am more qualified to write about than our local pizza shops. While there is only one in McKernan proper, we live a short walk or bike ride from some of the best and most distinct pizzerias in the city.

Campus Pizza. My first taste of Campus Pizza was shortly after I moved out of Lister Hall and into a basement suite in McKernan. Twenty years on, it has fed me more meals than any other restaurant on earth. Campus makes classic North American pan pizzas with consistently, uniformly crispy bottoms, concentrated, herbaceous tomato sauce, and generous toppings. A few years ago they introduced signature pies, novel concoctions like perogy pizza, donair pizza, and taco pizza. These are all fine in their own way, but there is little that can dissuade me from their pepperoni pizza with its classic flavours of chili and fennel.

The current owners have extended Campus Pizza's hours late into the night (3am on Saturdays!), a major boon to McKernan's university students and other night owls.

Sepp's. A short walk north, in Garneau, you can get the best New York style pizza in the city, bar none. Sepp's is unique in Edmonton in many ways. Orders can't be phoned in; they must be placed online. Not only is the pizza strictly take-out, there isn't even an indoor space for customers to enter: you just walk up to a window on the south side of Ace Coffee to pick up your order.

With the exception of a puffy, chewy crust, New York pies are wide and flat as a bedsheet. Sepp's crust is ultra-thin but persistently crispy: it's almost miraculous how such a thin layer of bread can remain so crisp while in contact with sauce and cheese. Toppings are nuovo-Italian, so expect "prosciutto cotto" instead of "ham". My favourite Sepp's pie is the Apulo, with spicy soppressata and jalapeño balanced

by a sweet honey drizzle. Sepp's might be the most expensive pizza in Edmonton on a dollars per gram measure, but there is nothing else quite like it within a day's drive.

High Dough Detroit Style Pizza occupies an awkward segment of Calgary Trail that I have not thought about much since the Billingsgate Seafood Market closed. It moved here after rapidly outgrowing its first location in Garneau, where the owners had previously operated Three Boars. The conversion of Boars to High Dough was perhaps the smartest and most successful COVID-era pivot in the Edmonton restaurant scene.

Detroit style pizzas are thick, rectangular slabs, with cheese sprinkled right to the very edge of the pie. Along the edges where the cheese meets the pan there is a crispy lip of lacy, caramelized cheese that brings deeply savoury flavours and a small universe of texture. These are hefty pizzas: one pie will comfortably feed two, especially if you tack a Tahini Caesar Salad onto your order.

The High Dough menu contains some quirky flavours: there's a Korean pie with kimchi, for instance, and a perogy-esque pie with potato, bacon, garlic, and dill. For

the traditionalists, there is an excellent pepperoni pizza. High Dough's pepperoni is a narrow, dry style. The sliced rounds are like coins, and when baked they form little crunchy cups with a bit of spicy oil pooled in the bottom. High Dough also has what is probably the city's best take on donair pizza. The spiced meat is crumbled instead of sliced, and the infamous 'white sauce' is syrupy-sweet, but counterpoised by fresh tomato and sharp pickled jalapeños.

Rosso Pizzeria. Back in Garneau, Rosso Pizzeria serves old-school, Neapolitan style pizza. This is hand-stretched dough with lovely, large, irregular bubbles that blister and burn in the intense heat of a wood oven. The sauce is essentially just crushed San Marzano tomatoes, and the cheese and toppings are sparse, letting the crispy, chewy dough shine.

Rosso does take-out, but as the only full-service dine-in pizza joint in the area, it is a great place to turn a pizza into an entire evening. Start with a negroni and olives or roasted cauliflower, then order an ice-cold Peroni, or a frothy Lambrusco, and savour your pizza. Finish with a small caffe affogato: it's just the jolt of sugar and caffeine you need to start your walk back to McKernan.

more opportunities for engagement

he final phase of District Planning public engagement is scheduled from October 23 to December 1, 2023. The city project team wants to hear Edmontonians' feedback and perspectives on potential future work, the refined policies, and content of the draft District Policies.

There is a series of District Planning Information Sessions through October and November, as well as opportunities to share feedback by booking a one-on-one Chat With a Planner session, and online surveys.

The Benefits of Community League Membership

hile most of our community social events are open to all McKernan residents, purchasing a community league membership lets you take advantage of other amenities, notably the outdoor rink, as well as participate directly in community decisions by voting at League meetings.

There are also some great discounts available to league members. Perhaps the most compelling is at City of Edmonton recreation centres. Simply show your current community league membership and get 20% off monthly and annual passes, or 15% off multiadmission passes. This means that an annual adult membership costs only \$400 instead of the usual \$500. With the multi-admission passes an adult can go to a rec centre for as little as \$6.90 per visit.

These generous discounts are the result of a partnership between the Edmonton Federation of Community Leagues and the City of Edmonton. It is called the Community League Wellness Program (CLWP).

League memberships are affordable:

- \$15 for single adults
- \$25 for households, including 2 adults and all children under 18
- \$20 for single parent households, including all children under 18
- \$10 for seniors and students.

Membership terms are from September 1 to August 31. Depending on what facilities you use at city rec centres, the discounts provided by the CLWP can cover the cost of a community league membership in only a few visits.

Other business partners offering discounts to league members include Cloverdale Paint, Acclaimed! Heating Cooling and Furnace Cleaning, and the U of A Bookstore.
