"It's a beautiful day in your neighborhood"

St. Peter's Catholic School, 74 Ave & 112 St, established in 1950. Once run with the Catholic Brotherhood, then Sisterhood, then occupied by administrative services - all gone now. A soccer field is planned and a larger housing unit on the 114th side.

Vacant houses attracting problems

Four vacant and poorly secured properties on University Ave. are causing headaches and concerns for residents, while the city tries to get the owner to step up and handle the issue.

The houses at 11225, 11231, 11235 and 11237 University Ave. have been vacant for months or longer, and have become significant problem properties over the summer. Squatters have broken into them, sometimes multiple times and for extended periods. In one house, a trespasser appears to have tampered with the gas line, causing a major gas leak that forced a response from multiple fire services and other emergency crews. In another of the houses, a trespasser started a fire that consumed most of the back half of the building, leaving it open to the elements and unable to be secured. Either of these events could have had tragic consequences for the people involved, or for residents nearby.

A spike in crime nearby may also be attributable to some of the people who are using the houses as a base, and some residents have reported threatening or dangerous behaviour by people entering or leaving the houses.

The city's problem property servicec has been working hard to try to reduce the issues. They have attempted to secure the buildings but people quickly returned to pry off the boards and access the houses again. The city may soon be forced to escalate to installing fencing or even demolishing the buildings (at a cost that will be billed back to the owner) if the owner is unwilling to ensure they are safe. Bylaws require that owners be given time to respond to problems, but this delay is extending the headache for neighbours (and presumably for city staff, police and firefighters as well).

Meanwhile, community residents are encouraged to keep an eye out for issues on the site, including trespassers. If you spot any issues, contact 311 for nonemergency issues or 911 for emergencies. Any problem property can be reported via communitypropertysafetyteam@edmonton.ca.

Mid-block rezonings down dramatically

As noted last month, a June 30 public hearing amended the Development Policy to remove support for mid-block rezonings to RSM. As a result, multiple rezoning requests in McKernan have now been withdrawn by their developers, according to the city's Land Development Applications Map. See the list below for a list of current rezoning applications. Hopefully this will restrict upzonings to more suitable sites: lots directly on nodes or corridors, or on corners close to transit stations or nodes/corridors.

Developer loses rezoning, councillors unimpressed

The attitude of city councillors seems to have shifted somewhat to be more discerning about rezoning applications, thanks to pushback from citizens over infill issues, and the behaviour of some developers is now finally receiving opposition. This was highlighted at a public hearing on Sept. 15, where committee members, administration and community residents who came to speak were stunned to hear that the developer, Everfor, was requesting a rezoning not to add a garage (as expected) but instead to allow for an extra suite in the building — which had already been built without permit. The building at 7411-113 St. was constructed with an extra basement unit — and the rezoning to RSM h 12.0 was asked for to "allow" this illegal unit to be retained.

This attempt to ask for forgiveness instead of permission went over poorly, with a speaker calling this a "clear violation" of the social contract with residents. Committee members asked why Everfor, who is one of the most-active developers in this part of Edmonton, hadn't asked for a rezoning before building. They also noted that they need to enforce the spirit of the process and not just the letter of the zoning bylaw, or they risk losing trust and goodwill of Edmontonians.

After discussion, the proposal was defeated 0-12 in a rare show of unity on such issues.

The developer's representative at the council hearing appeared to have been somewhat contrite about some of the other issues that they have been very unpopular with neighbours, such as turning multiunit buildings into lodging houses or aggressively pursuing midblock rezonings. He claimed that the developer "does not do microsuites" or midblock rezonings anymore, although this remains to be proven.

Congestion-fighting ideas needed

The Mobility Strategies unit of the City of Edmonton has been tasked to address the motion advanced by City Council on April 8, 2025 for Administration to identify interventions that will reduce or eliminate shortcutting through the Belgravia neighbourhood. This project kicked off in early September and is anticipated to continue through June 2026.

Traffic in the area was video recorded in the third week of September. Once the video is processed and traffic surveys are complete, the project team will schedule an engagement session to share a summary of the existing traffic conditions directly with neighbourhood residents and to learn more about people's experiences and concerns on neighbourhood streets.

What we need from you

It would be helpful for the Project Team to hear directly from neighbourhood residents on how they would address this challenge. These discussions will help the Project Team better understand the nuances of the neighbourhood road network and traffic patterns. So please, brainstorm and bring your ideas with you!

This engagement event is likely to occur in November. Once details are confirmed, the project team will work to share and advertise them with neighbourhood residents (through the Belgravia and McKernan Community Leagues and other channels, such as a project newsletter and website, which are currently being developed and should be rolled out in late October).

Mobility Strategies looks forward to working with the Belgravia / McKernan Communities to better understand residents' concerns and experiences, and to develop an approach to reduce shortcutting through the neighbourhood.
